Check the **VA WEAMS** webpage to ensure your selected academic programs are covered by the VA Educational Benefits. The VR&E counselors guide for applicants Step 1 through the DoVa's Ch. 31 process. After the student has been approved by their VR&E counselor, students must complete the **Annual Benefit Application** once per academic year, on the **UIC SVA web page** under the Benefits and Forms tab.

- VR&E counselors must submit a CH 31 authorization to UIC Step 2 Student Veterans Affairs. This authorization is accepted in place of the Certificate of Eligibility.
- Step 3 Every semester, students must submit a signed <u>Advisor</u> Verification Form, on the <u>Upload Advisor Verification tab</u> on our UIC SVA web page under the Benefits and Forms tab.







CHAPTER 33

Post 9-11 GI Bill

Step 1

Check the <u>VA WEAMS webpage</u> to ensure your selected academic programs are covered by the VA Educational Benefits. If this is the student's first time applying to use these benefits, or if a program or benefit change is made they must obtain a <u>US Department of Veterans</u>

<u>Affairs Certificate of Eligibility (COE)</u>. For first time applicants who are not using transfer benefits, the VA will require a DD 214, in order to issue a COE. For those using transfer benefits, here is an Informational webpage to learn about how to transfer VA Benefits.

Once the COE is obtained students can upload this document during the next step.

Step 2 Students must complete the <u>Annual Benefit Application</u> once per academic year on the <u>UIC 5VA web page under the Benefits and Forms tab</u>. This is also where students can upload their COE.

Step 3 Form, on the <u>Upload Advisor Verification</u> tab on our UIC SVA web page under the Benefits and Forms tab.

Illinois student veterans who are rated less than 100% are encouraged to apply for the Illinois Veterans Grant (IVG). Information for this can be found in the following pages.


